





The step we have taken is unprecedented as we have gone ahead beyond Manifesto to fashion out a rolling plan that clearly shows where Anambra is at the moment and where the State ought to be and will be in the next couple of years

under my watch. This Manifesto is essentially teased out of the said Economic Blueprint (the ASSET Document) and therefore a mere tip of the iceberg of the glorious plan of my administration and Social Contract with the people of the State as the economic hub for Nigeria and Africa.



# ASSET ONE: GOVERNANCE REFORMS

The World Bank wrote: “...Good The governance is epitomized by predictable, open, and enlightened policymaking (that is, transparent processes); a bureaucracy imbued with a professional ethos; an executive arm of government accountable for its actions; and a strong civil society participating in public affairs; and all behaving under the rule of law...”


This captures our vision for good governance which we plan to introduce.

## OUR ATTENTION IN GOVERNANCE REFORMS WILL FOCUS ON THE FOLLOWING:

- Local Government Autonomy
- Civil and Public service reforms
- Judicial Reforms and uphold the Rule of Law
- Intolerance towards Corruption; entrenching Transparency, Accountability and Probity
- Community Development and Traditional Institutional Reforms



# LOCAL GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS



- Full compliance to Local Government Autonomy as contemplated in the 1999 Constitution.
- Conduct Local Government Election Within Six Months in office and in accordance with the provisions of the law.
- Reformation of the State Local Government Service Commission to ensure that obnoxious practices are removed and new ideas are accommodated.
- Integrity on issues of recruitment, placement, training and re-training of Local Government personnel
- Entrenchment of e-governance at the Local Government level

It is time to make this tier of government to serve the purpose for which it is meant. The greatest tragedy of a failed system of all time is the obvious neglect of the powers of the local government. To reverse this trend, our government shall ensure the following:

**...CONDUCT LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION WITHIN SIX MONTHS IN OFFICE AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAW.**

## OTHER MATTERS OF INTEREST IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFORMS ARE:

I. Budget, Tax, Revenue and expenditures at the Local Government are in line with the provision of the relevant laws. This we believe will allow cash flow in the local government.

ii. Replicating the “Anambra State Agency for Civil Service Compliance and Monitoring [ASACSCM]” at the local government levels.


## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND TRADITIONAL INSTITUTIONS

After the civil war, East Central State was rebuilt using the town unions. Anambra State has 179 town structures, which can be deployed and unitized effectively for community development. We plan to regard the town unions as a 'fourth tier of government' with a clear delegated mandate to deliver in specific areas and that way, take government and governance to the doorsteps of Ndi-Anambra.

**ANAMBRA STATE HAS 179 TOWN STRUCTURES, WHICH CAN BE DEPLOYED AND UNITIZED EFFECTIVELY FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.**

Community growth could be traced to very early times when the need for communal life was first understood by men. The construction of roads leading to streams or markets, the construction of houses, agriculture, particularly during harvests, the construction of villages and market squares are examples of activities where collective action was required in order to achieve a common goal in the early days.






## JUDICIAL REFORMS

The Judiciary, as we know, is the last hope of the common man. Findings suggest that the major challenge in the Anambra State Judicial Reform is in the area of Appointment, Recruitment, Placement and Promotion. To fix this, our government will embark on constructive and strategic policy readjustment in order to overhaul these key areas of concern:

- Ensure transparency and probity in the appointment of Magistrates and Judges;
- Establish the Anambra State Judiciary Pensions Board (ASJPB).
- Provide more Court buildings and give a facelift to the existing ones, especially the Magistrate and High Courts.
- Liaise with the JUDICIAL SERVICE COMMISSION (JSC) to establish more specialized Courts and Multi-Door Courts (MDCs) to hasten the dispensation of justice.



Corruption takes place when, in pursuit of private interests, public officials and private individuals break the law. Bribery and extortion are the most hateful forms of corruption; including the allocation of public resources to cater for political affiliations to favour a few. Corruption levies a huge cost on any developing society in a variety of ways, including the subversion of development plans, the diversion of resources that might have been invested productively; as well as the disruption of the transparent and smooth functioning of markets. This creates uncertainty for investors.



## INTOLERANCE TOWARDS CORRUPTION, TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY AND PROBITY

- Quarterly Publication of the audited accounts of the State expenditures.
- Hold Quarterly Servant Interactive Sessions with the State Workforce (QSSIS).
- Ensure Effective Whistleblowing Framework.
- Ensure that the people, no matter how highly placed, are held accountable for misappropriating public funds.
- Set-up an Anti-Corruption Network within the State to be called "ANAMBRA STATE ANTI-CORRUPTION NETWORK (ASAN)", with requisite Laws to ensure that justice is served.





**A**s a government, we must take the issue of community development and partnership with traditional institutions very seriously.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND TRADITIONAL INSTITUTIONS

**TO ACHIEVE THIS, OUR GOVERNMENT SHALL DO THE FOLLOWING:**

- Honour and proper recognition to our Traditional Rulers
- Offer more incentives to the already existing Town Governments across the Communities in Anambra State.
- Encourage Community Leadership such as; Age Grades, Vigilante and Women Leadership by assigning responsibilities.
- Ensure a re-orientation of the concept of community development.
- The rampant and endemic corruption associated with institutions for community development shall be nipped in the bud. This will be done by ensuring the establishment of the Community Based Organization Department (CBOD).

# ASSET TWO: ECONOMY, TRADE AND INVESTMENT

States must develop according to their comparative advantage. Comparative advantage is simply an economy's ability to focus on the production of goods or services at a lower opportunity cost than one's competitors. A comparative advantage gives one the ability to do more and stay stronger. Anambra is reputed for its prowess in commerce, technology, education, sports and many more. Any economic policy developed for Anambra State that does not derive from this trajectory is utopic and a misplacement of priorities.

Anambra state, no doubt, has the highest potential to be the strongest economy in Nigeria. A strong economy implies: a high rate of economic growth. This means an expansion in economic output in Anambra State under my watch with the aim of producing higher average incomes and expenditure that will bring about manageable inflation. The worrisome economic state of affairs in Anambra State shows that our great fortress and walls of wealth have been broken, and our government is positioned to holistically interrogate the underlying issues and find a permanent fix.



## ECONOMY, TRADE AND INVESTMENT

- Digital Economy (DE), Fiscal Responsibility, Revenue and Budget Process (FRBP).
- Expansion in economic output to produce higher average incomes
- 100,000 jobs Per Annum
- Firmly anchor Trade facilitation and incentivize Private Public Partnership and ensuring Ease of Doing Business

Essentially, we have to do through these strategic action plans, is to connect Anambra State to where the world is at the moment and make her ready to advance with the rest, thus becoming an advanced economy. This is doable with the level of potentials haboured by the state, both at home and in diaspora.

# POLICY THRUSTS

Ensuring the doubling of the state's industrial GDP within, and actualizing a diversified and competitive economy through the implementation of integrated and inclusive industrial development policies. Under my watch, Anambra State Industrial Development Strategy (ASIDS) shall provide a robust roadmap for balanced-growth-oriented industrialization. The industrialization policy thrust shall be driven by three (3) key pillars, namely, manufacturing sector development (MSD), Agro-Allied Development (AAD) and Oil and Gas Investment (OGI).



Trade and investment policy shall focus on export promotion, Made-in-Anambra-Nigeria (MIAN), market reforms, technotrade and invest-in-Anambra strategies. We shall facilitate the creation of investment and trade ecosystem that guarantees seamless export trade transaction for Ndi-Anambra in the areas where the state has obvious comparative advantages; accelerate trade transaction from (and to) any part of Nigeria; and foster unparalleled wealth creation and high rate of employment.

# AGRICULTURE AND FOOD SECURITY

Anambra State has a land mass of 4887sq km, and approximately 70% (3420.9 sq km) of the land is arable (excellent for Agriculture) and very fertile. One of our core mandates is to revitalize the agricultural sector and make it one of the most lucrative sectors of the state for both employment and income generation.

### WE SHALL TAKE STEPS TO REVITALIZE AGRICULTURE IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

- Engaging stake holders of the sector in the State and taking their inputs on how to bring a total turn around in the sector.
- Ensuring that farmers have access to Federal Government loans by mediating and fast tracking the process.
- Drastically reduce hunger by greatly subsidizing agricultural inputs such as seedlings, fertilizers etc.
- Working on establishing a reliable irrigation supply to ensure an all-year-round farming.

### FOOD SECURITY

Our mandate is to ensure food security in the state and guarantee self-sufficiency. This will also lead us to ascertain the actual output of the total arable land in the state, if it is cultivated optimally.

It is estimated that if the arable land of Anambra State is cultivated optimally, our land can feed 9.2 million persons annually.



## TO ENSURE THAT AGRICULTURE ATTAINS ITS FULL POTENTIALS IN THE STATE, WE SHALL PURSUE OUR MANDATE IN AGRICULTURAL SECTOR DEVELOPMENT UNDER THE FOLLOWING SIX (6) PILLARS:

### AGRO LOANS

We shall earmark a substantial Agricultural intervention fund. This will help to resuscitate the underdeveloped agricultural sector in Anambra State. The revolving agricultural loan will be used to run an integrated scheme that involves a buy-back, to enable farmers focus on production. Our strategic focus is on the following areas; crop, livestock, and fish production and processing.



### PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP

Our administration will partner with both local and foreign investors to boost investment in agricultural value chain. Top priority will be given to those investing in crop, livestock and fish production and processing; Agro trading and export.

Our government shall create the enabling environment through investing in infrastructural development, technology and innovation in storage, extension workers and supply chain. This will guarantee a lasting competitive advantage for the farmers and ensure inclusiveness in the agro-value chain.



### LEVERAGING ON TECHNOLOGIES

Technology and innovation guarantee sustainability in every agricultural sector. We understand that subsistent farming has its limitations. For this reason, our government will create a fully-integrated system that ensures optimal utilization of the 342,090 hectares of arable land which Anambra State is blessed with.

We will make maximum use of these technologies in the following areas;

- **Storage of agro produce**
- **Fighting pests and diseases**
- **Mechanization**
- **Weather**
- **Creation of Agricultural portal**

These innovative technologies will drastically reduce wastages, eliminate attacks by pests and diseases, guarantee optimal production, and ensure that the farm produce meets international best standards.

### YOUTH PARTICIPATION: ONE YOUTH ONE FARM PROJECT

My government shall make agriculture very attractive to ensure Youth participations through mechanization, agro info digitization, access to the global markets and Produce Buyoff Boards. One of the most important parts of our social contract with Ndi-Anambra is to ensure that the youths prosper. We will create 10,000 direct and indirect jobs in the agro-value chain in the 21 local governments crop, livestock, and fish production and processing. My administration shall set up Produce Buybacks from the farmers, especially the Youths so that they do not have to worry over how to dispose produce.



### SECURITY: MAKING ANAMBRA A SAFE HAVEN FOR ALL

- Amending the 2014 Anambra State Vigilante law to make it more government-funded, community-driven, merit-based, and in liaison with other intelligence agencies.
- Adopt a proactive, competitive, multidimensional, sustainable, inclusive, intelligence-based, and technology-driven approach to tackle crime.
- Adopt preemptive measures such as curbing social grievances.
- We shall recruit, train, and properly remunerate 5,000 youths annually under the new ASVT.
- My government shall invest significantly in security through improved budgetary allocation and utilization of "Security votes" by judiciously committing 100% of the amount for the purpose for which it is meant.
- Make Anambra will be a shining radiance and pacesetter in terms of security provision for the prosperity of the state.

# ASSET FIVE:

## HUMAN CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL INCLUSION

Human capital development is the process of improving an organization's employee performance, capabilities, and resources. The people that power and facilitate the corporate and commercial values of a State are assets to be invested in. Economic progression achieved by any society is strongly associated with the quality of its human capital and social interaction. The ASSET agenda Prioritizes human capital development and social inclusion as central anchors of our developmental pursuit. According to available records, Human Development Index (HDI) for Anambra State is 0.47 on a scale of 0 to 1.

### ANCHOR 1: EDUCATION

Recognizing the role of education as a key driver of human development, the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 4 was

dedicated to “ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education and promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all”. Admittedly, Anambra state invested elaborately in education between 2006 and 2014; an action that ranked Anambra best in education outcome until recent times. UNDP report shows that education index in Anambra declined.



Unfortunately, Anambra state has continued to retrogress instead of making progress in healthcare management.

### **ANCHOR 3: SOCIAL INCLUSION AND POVERTY REDUCTION**

Social inclusion is the process of improving the terms of participation in society, particularly for people who are disadvantaged, through enhancing opportunities, access to resources, voice and respect for rights. It is, therefore, at the heart of social and human development. Most economic, social and political structures are intrinsically designed to reinforce social exclusion. This constantly resonates in economic disempowerment, gender discrimination, social inequality and poverty. According to Statistics, 14.8% of Anambra residents are poor. UNDP Report even placed the incidence of poverty at 25.4% of household. Ndi-Anambra are strong, hardworking and resilient and the least we can do is to provide them with the enabling environment and all necessary support to thrive through improved

### **POLICY THRUST**


rice/Stine Mills to a strategic partnership meeting with the Chinese Consular General in Lagos.

Over the years, the company has invested over N100 billion in the development of basic facilities meant to enhance effective distribution of petroleum products in the country, the depot of Capital Oil and Gas has a total storage capacity of 200million litres. The Ifeanyi Ubah International Stadium which is approved by the Confederation of African Football (CAF) was constructed from scratch in less than 2 years and became the first privately owned stadium in Nigeria to be approved by the African Football governing body to host a Continental match. FC Ifeanyi Ubah also became the first football team from Anambra State to have a CAF match played at their stadium.

Senator Ifeanyi Ubah is the first individual in Nigeria to single handedly fund a Cathedral project comprising of 109 parishes, 12m all-round filled concrete foundation, over 5,000 seating capacity, 146 already built underground tombs, 8-storey bell tower, 5-storey elevation and over 750 car parking capacity.




# ANAMBRA PROGRESSIVES & DEVELOPMENT UNION






# HARNESSING THE DIASPORA ANAMBRA ECONOMY

**I**n 2018 alone, migrant remittances to Nigeria equaled US\$25 billion, representing 6.1% of GDP. This also represents 14% year-on-year growth from the \$22 billion receipt in 2017. The 2018 figure translates to 83% of the Federal Government budget in 2018 and 11 times the FDI flows in the same period. It is believed that about 25% of these diaspora inflows in monetary and human capital terms are from Anambra State. This is really huge. The Diaspora Community is, therefore, critical to the socioeconomic development of their

nation (and state). This is recognized through their economic (finance – capital and investment) and non-economic (talents, dexterities, and knowledge transfer) complementary roles.

- Engage youths through sports in order to reduce crime caused by idleness.


# ANAMBRA STATE SPORTS COMMISSION


## PARTNERSHIP WITH NOLLYWOOD:


